Chilli Outlook – December 2018

India is the world's largest producer, consumer and exporter of chillies in the world. India is the world leader in chilli production followed by China, Thailand, Ethiopia and Indonesia. Indian chilli is considered to be world famous for two important commercial qualities of color and pungency levels. Indian chilli is mainly exported to Asian countries like Vietnam, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and U.A.E.

In India, major chilli producing states are Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh. In Andhra Pradesh, as on 26th September 2018, about 116,578 hectares was reported under red chilli. Till now, chilli area coverage in Guntur, Kurnool and Krishna regions is reported as 65,259 hectares, 15,584 hectares and 12,816 hectares respectively.


As on 26th September 2018, red chilli sown area in Telangana was reported as 46,126 hectares as compared to only 24,920 hectares in the corresponding period of last year. Among major chilli growing districts, Khammam has reported maximum 18,010 hectares followed by Mahabubabad (10758 hectares), Gadwal (Jogulamba) (6,289 hectares) and Warangal (Rural) (1,794 hectares). Currently, chilli is at fruit development stage. New crop arrivals are likely to enter into markets from last week of January.

Red Chilli production for 2019-20 is estimated at 12.00 lakh MT compared to earlier estimate of 12.45 lakh MT, while previous year's production was 10.50 lakh MT (Agriwatch).

The trend in average monthly domestic and international chilli prices from January 2016 to October 2018 presented in Fig 1 clearly indicates that the domestic prices are highly influenced by international prices. The international and domestic prices had reported as 1.35 US\$/lb and 80.00Rs/Kg respectively in October 2018 also as that of during previous month. International chilli prices at New York market remain stable since April 2018.




Fig.2: Chilli Prices at Warangal and Khammam Markets in the Month of November 2018

Currently, Chilli (NCDEX quality) in Warangal is trading steady at Rs. 10,000 - 10600 per quintal. Chilli prices may not fall much further from current levels, as buying from stockiest, exporters, masala millers etc. will continue.

Chilli Price Outlook

In September, chilli export reported up around 39,876 MT as compared to August (34,639 MT). Currently exporters demand was reported low in Guntur market as prices are moving to higher levels.

In Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, still Chilli standing crop reported at very crucial stage due to lower rainfall and in some areas virus infection was reported. As per current situation, Andhra Pradesh chilli production is likely to lower by 10% from earlier estimates. If hot weather condition continues in coming days, the damage percentage may increase as well.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that chilli is likely to trade in price range between **Rs.7500** – **8500** per quintal in the month of December 2018.
