
Bengalgram Outlook – April 2018

India is the largest producer of bengalgram followed by Pakistan, Turkey and Iran. India produces around 6 to 8 million tonnes and contributes around 70 percent of the total world production. Bengalgram is the most largely produced pulse crop in India accounting for a share of 40% of the total pulse production.


About 89.58 lakh ha area coverage was reported under bengalgram during rabi 2017-18. The states of Madhya Pradesh (31.24 lakh ha), Maharashtra (14.22 lakh ha), Rajasthan (13.95 lakh ha), Karnataka (13.25 lakh ha), Uttar Pradesh (5.20 lakh ha) and Andhra Pradesh (4.3 lakh ha) are the major producers of bengalgram in India.

Bengalgram production in 2017-18 is expected to increase to 11.10 million tonnes from 9.38 lakh tonnes last year. India has imported about 9.8 lakh tonnes of bengalgram till January 2018 (Figure 2). The Government has decided to ban import of all pulses to support domestic prices. However, the higher production in the current season has led to sharp fall in its price.

Figure 2: India's imports of bengalgram in lakh tonnes




Figure 3: Average monthly prices of bengalgram in major markets of India (Rs/q)

All major markets of bengalgram in the country were found to be integrated as indicated by the price movement in Figure 3. The prices which were about Rs. 5000 per quintal during April 2016 have rise to more than Rs. 9000 per quintal in October 2016 and then started declining. Currently, bengalgram is being traded in all major markets of country at around Rs. 3700 per quintal while, the MSP is Rs. 4400.

In Telangana state, rabi 2017-18 acreage covered under bengalgram was about 0.95 lakh ha. The major districts producing this crop in Telangana are Kama Reddy (19,653 ha), Nirmal (18,364 ha), Gadwal (12,434 ha), Adilabad (10,842 ha) and Nizamabad (9,812 ha). The major markets for this crop in Telangana are Narayanpet, Adilabad, Bainsa, Nizamabad, Sadasivpet, Zaheerabad, Parigi and Tandur.

So far, NAFED has procured 157320 MT of bengalgram at MSP during the current season. Of total procurement, maximum quantity was from Karnataka (73399 MT) followed by Telangana (39779 MT), Andhra Pradesh (24482 MT), Rajasthan (11465 MT) and Maharashtra (8193 MT).

All India average price of bengalgram has increased by 1.38% to Rs 3770 per quintal. Market is expected to move further up. In Delhi market, it is being traded at Rs 3800-3850 per quintal. In Mumbai, Australian bengalgram is being offered at Rs 3800 per quintal. Chana prices are likely to witness steady to slightly firm tone on increasing arrivals. Higher duty of 60% on import would continue to restrict import and its impact might be seen when arrivals start declining.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that Bengalgram is likely to trade in price range between Rs. 3700 - 3900 per quintal in the month of April 2018.
