Cotton Outlook - May 2019

World Scenario

Global 2018-19 cotton area and production are projected at 33.1 million hectares (82 million acres) and 118.9 million bales, which were nearly 2 and 4 percent less than that of 2017-18 estimates respectively. Cotton production in most of the major producing countries except Brazil and Pakistan is expected to decline. India is projected to produce 27.0 million bales of cotton in 2018-19, which was 7 percent less than the production in 2017-18. Although yield is expected to rebound above the 5-year average, a 4 percent reduction in area is forecast in 2018-19. China is projected to produce 27.5 million bales of cotton in 2018-19. Meanwhile, production increases of 3.5 lakh bales for Brazil and 3.0 lakh bales for Pakistan in 2018-19 are projected to push their estimates to 11.75 and 7.7 million bales respectively.

The A Index climbed from values near 82 cents/lbin the middle of last month to those near 88 cents/lb most recently. Chinese cotton prices represented by the CC Index (3128B) were comparatively stable in both international and domestic terms, holding to values near 105 cents/lb and 15,600 RMB/ton.

Indian spot prices (Shankar-6 quality) increased in both international (from 77 to 85 cents/lb) and domestic terms (from 42,500 to 46,200 INR/candy). Pakistani spot prices were steady at values close to 75 cents/lb or 8,700 PKR/maund.

All India daily cotton arrivals are reported to be about 75,000 bales according to Cotton Association of India. India remains in the market for U.S. cotton which supports prices to remain high. China, Vietnam and Turkey were major buyers of Indian cotton.

India's current cotton crop arrivals reached 27.88 million bales until 16th April 2019, as per the latest CCI report. Total cotton supply projected is 290.00 lakh bales of 170 Kg each during the period from October 2018 to March 2019 which consists of the arrival of 255.83 lakh bales and imports of 6.17 lakh bales up to 31st March 2019 with an opening stock of 28 lakh bales at the beginning of the season.

According to CAI, the balance sheet projects total cotton supply of 37.60 million bales, a domestic consumption of 31.60 million bales, exports of 4.70 million bales and a carry-over stock of 1.3 million bales for 2018-19. New crop planting started in some areas of North India. Good availability of canal water and better prices of seed cotton in the current season against competing crops will likely favor cotton sowing in North India.

Indian Scenario

As on 20thSeptember 2018, the area covered under cotton during current season was 120.64 lakh hectares, which was 124.44 lakh hectares during corresponding period of last year. Cotton production during 2018-19was estimated at358.70 lakh bales. Among the states, Gujarat stood first with 107.37 lakh bales followed by Maharashtra with 83.30 lakh bales and Telangana with 52.07 lakh bales, all these three states combined contributing nearly 67% to total cotton production during 2018-19.

Domestic Trade information

Indian domestic prices traded firm during April month, mainly due to lower daily arrivals which declined by 10-12% and the arrivals are likely to end by mid of May month. The price in Indian market is higher than that internationally. The market may move up only through larger off take by exporters or by domestic industry.

Average price of lint at Sirsa during the month was Rs. 4845 per maund (of 37.32 Kg each), firmer compared to the previous month price of Rs. 4484. Cotton fiber (Shankar-6) prices noticed highest this month in this season. Average price was Rs. 46,045.8 per candy (of 355.6 Kg each) during the month, which was Rs. 41,172 per candy previous month.

Cotton in Telangana

As on 26th September 2018 the area under cotton was 17,96,471 hectares as against 19,09,275 hectares during corresponding period of last year. Among the districts, Nalgonda and Sangareddy recorded increased area under cotton as compared to last year, while in all other districts the same was reduced.

Till now 40 lakh bales have been shipped according to CAI and expected to reach up to 47 lakh bales till the end of this season. At the moment exports are in halt due to lower availability and lower demand of Indian cotton because of higher prices than the international prices.

Cotton prices expected to rise slowly due to China's state cotton reserve's auction which starts from 5th May and would likely to be firmer after two weeks due to increased booked imports rather than exports. Currently prices are ruling above MSP which depicts that the traders are actively procuring cotton at competitive rates. This may occur gradually over the next few months

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that Cotton prices are likely to trade in price range between **Rs.5500-6000** per quintal during May 2019.
