Maize Outlook – April 2019

Maize or corn (*Zea mays*) is cultivated globally being one of the most important cereal crops worldwide. As per USDA, U.S corn exports reached 30.04 MMT in the 2018-19 marketing year. At 1.26 MMT (for the period 22nd Mar- 28th Mar, 2019) US corn exports were up 32 percent from the previous week and 55 percent from the previous 4-week average; mainly for the destination like Mexico (397,000 MT), Japan (180,400 MT), Colombia (163,700 MT), Peru (145,600 MT), and South Korea (72,500 MT).

In India, rabi maize was sown in around 15.56 lakh hectares as of 22nd February, 2019 which was lower than 17.28 lakh hectares during corresponding period last year. In Bihar, maize was sown in around 4.75 lakh hectares which was almost equal to 4.70 lakh hectares during corresponding period last year. Crop conditions are favorable till the time. All India rabi maize production is estimated by at 5.67 MMT for the year 2018-19.

In Nizamabad region, maize is likely to trade steady to range bound in the near term despite new crop arrival pressure as demand of Hyderabad and Pune feed makers supporting to the market. As per trade sources, in Godavari district, new crop quality is good and being delivered to Vijayawada at Rs. 1930- 1950 per quintal while, in Tenali district of Andhra Pradesh, crop arrivals are likely to start soon.

Maize modal price at Kesamudram market ranged between Rs. 1762 – 1917 per quintal during March 2019. The central government has increased the minimum support price of maize for the year 2018-19 by 19.3% from Rs. 1425 to Rs. 1700 per quintal.

Maize Price Outlook

Corn prices on CBOT fall by 5.61 USD/MT to 140.35 USD/MT for May contract compared to last month as USDA estimated U.S. stocks and spring plantings above than trade expectations. Further, price direction depends on demand for U.S corn which is expected to be lower due to high competition from South America.

In Nizamabad, maize is moving to Hyderabad at Rs. 2150 per quintal. Meanwhile, maize is moving towards Bangalore at Rs. 2200 per quintal, Namakkal at Rs. 2270-2280 per quintal, Chitradurga at Rs. 2100 per quintal, Chennai at Rs. 2300 per quintal, Sangali at Rs. 2150 per quintal and Ranebennur at Rs. 2100 per quintal (Delivered price); sourced from Devangere. In Bihar, maize is moving towards Kolkata at Rs. 2150 per quintal.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expects that maize could trade in a range of Rs. 1750-2000 per quintal during the month of April, 2019.
