# **Cotton Outlook – August 2019**

## **World Scenario**

Global 2019-20 cotton area, production and productivity are projected at 34.7 million hectares (85.8 million acres), 125.8 million bales and 789 Kg/ha, which were nearly 3.5 and 5 percent greater than that of 2018-19 estimates respectively. The increase in production was expected due to larger estimates in USA and India i.e., 3.6 and 3 million bales more than the previous year respectively. However, production in China (27.75 million bales) and Pakistan (8 million bales) is expected to remain same. India's cotton crop is projected at 29 million bales which were 10 percent above the previous year. India is forecast to account for 23 percent of the world's cotton production in 2019-20.

#### **International Price Movement**

Most benchmark prices decreased over the past month. Chinese spot prices were stable. After maintaining a range between 65 and 69 cents/lb since early May, the NY December contract broke lower in the second week of July and fell to levels near 63 cents/lb. Indian cotton prices (Shankar-6 quality) moved slightly lower over the past month, falling from 84 to 82 cents/lb in international terms and from 45,600 to 43,900 INR/candy in domestic terms.

The Indian market remained firm at 79.54 (cents/lbs) compared to the international prices in US (61.84 cents/lbs) and Brazil stood at 63.59 cents/lbs in the month end, on the back of lower production in India this year the prices stood higher. Cotton prices would remain firm against international prices at least till the beginning of the next season (Oct'19) due to lower arrivals. On the other hand the domestic prices were expected to go up but it has fallen to Rs.43000/candy against the beginning of the season which stood at Rs.46000/candy in the Indian market due to crash in demand amid US and China trade war despite the prevailing shortage conditions.

#### **Indian Scenario**

As on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2019, area under cotton during 2019-20 was 115.14 lakh ha as against 109.79 lakh ha in 2018-19 i.e., 4.87 percent more than the previous year. Among the states, higher area was reported from Maharashtra 41.98 lakh ha followed by Gujarat (23.76 lakh ha), Telangana (16.78 lakh ha), Rajasthan (6.36 lakh ha) and Punjab (4.02 lakh ha).

## **Domestic Trade information**

India cotton yarn exports declined by 32.95% in April-June, major decline in demand were from China (-50.58%). The trade war between China and US has affected the world trade due to which India's exports has declined and left with declining demand in domestic as well as in International market. Average price of Lint at Sirsa during the month was Rs. 4666.1 per maund (of 37.32 Kg each). Cotton fiber (Shankar-6) prices noticed highest this month in this season. Average price was Rs 44123 per candy (of 355.6 kg each) during the month, which was Rs 45491per candy previous month.

## **Cotton in Telangana**

As on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2019 area under cotton during 2019-20 was 17,23,965 hectares as against 17,06,504 hectares during 2018-19. Among the districts, Nalgonda stood first with 2,06,801 ha followed by Adilabad (1,32,047 ha), Nagarkurnool (1,16,332 ha), Sangareddy (1,08,350 ha) and Asifabad (1,02,009 ha).

India's cotton imports is likely to surge at 25 to 28 lakh bales in 2018-19 as against 15 lakh bales in previous year. Shortage of raw cotton has urged the textile mills to import cotton on large scale. Till July'19, around 14 lakh bales is expected to arrive out of the total contracted imports of 27 lakh bales for the season, while the remaining 10 - 11 lakh bales is expected to arrive until the end of season in September month.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that Cotton prices are likely to trade in price range between **Rs.5850-6150** per quintal during August 2019.
