## Paddy Outlook - April 2020

Paddy is cultivated globally being one of the most important cereal crops worldwide. USDA in its November report had estimated the global availability of rice at 67.10 million tons in 2019-20 marketing season. The same has been increased by 6 lakh tons to 67.16 million tons in the December report. The main reason for this is the increase in China's production. USDA has increased China's rice production estimates by 7 lakh tons to 14.77 million tons, based on the latest data from the National Bureau of Statistics of China.

As per the ministry of Agriculture, rabi rice acreage as on 31<sup>st</sup>January 2020 has increased by 13.78% to 28.80 lakh hectares as compared to 25.31 lakh hectares during the same period of last year. Higher acreage was covered in Tamil Nadu (10.42 lakh ha), Telangana (8.24 lakh ha) and Andhra Pradesh (6.01lakh ha), whereas, lower acreage was reported from major states such as Karnataka (0.08 lakh ha) as of 31<sup>st</sup> January 2020.

In Telangana, it has been sown in 15.80 lakh hectares as on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2020 which is double than 6.99 lakh hectares covered during corresponding period of last year. Major paddy growing districts in Telangana are Nalgonda (1.53 lakh ha), Suryapet (1.52 lakh ha), Nizamabad (1.28 lakh ha), Khammam (82247 ha), Jagtiyal (1.03 lakh ha), Peddapalli (78016 ha), Yadadri (80573 ha) and Karimnagar (88647 ha).

A nationwide lockdown in leading rice exporting country, India to curtail the spread of the corona virus pushed export prices to the lowest in about three months, while rates for the Thai variety came off multi-year peaks due to fluctuations in the local currency.

Modal prices of Paddy-Grade-A (RNR) at Kesamudram market and Paddy-Common at Suryapet market ranged between Rs. 2016 - 2102 and Rs. 1377 - 1569 per quintal during March 2020 respectively. The Government has increased MSP of normal grade paddy by 65 rupees to Rs. 1815 and 'A' grade paddy to Rs. 1835 per quintal.

## **Paddy Price Outlook**

India's 5% broken parboiled variety rates narrowed to \$361-\$365 per tonne this week, their lowest since late December, as rice exporters were struggling to operate due to the lockdown.

In Thailand, benchmark 5% broken rice rates fell to \$468-\$495 this week, from last week's 6½ year peak of \$480-\$505 due to fluctuations in the currency. Vietnam's 5% broken rice rates were not available after the government on Wednesday announced it halted signing new export contracts until March 28 under a review to ensure domestic supplies were sufficient during the epidemic. Domestic prices of rice have risen by 5% in Bangladesh, as corona virus fears triggered panic buying.

In the first 10 months of 2019-20 as compared to FY 2018-19 i.e., April 2019 to January 2020, Indian basmati rice exports are just 1% in terms of quantity and in dollar terms. There was a 10% drop. Due to lower shipments in last two months, basmati rice export volume may decline by 5% overall. Due to poor performance of basmati and non-basmati rice exports from India, pressure on domestic market prices has increased.

All-India progressive procurement of Rice as on 11.03.2020 for Kharif Marketing Season (KMS) 2019-20 is 381.17 lakh tonnes. The same in Telangana state figures 31.57 lakh tonnes. Under current lockdown situation due to Covid 19, Telangana State Government has started procuring rabi paddy production at MSP directly from famers through village procurement centres.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expects that Paddy-Grade-A (RNR) and Paddy-Common could trade in price ranges of Rs. 1900-2050 per quintal and Rs. 1400-1600 per quintal respectively during the month of April, 2020.
