Groundnut Outlook – February 2021

Groundnut (*Arachis hypogaea L.*) is an important oilseed crop in India which occupies first position in terms of area and second position in terms of production. China ranks first in groundnut production with 17.39 million tonnes followed by India 6.70 million tonnes, Nigeria 2.89 lakh tonnes, Sudan 2.88 million tonnes and Myanmar 1.60 million tonnes account for 37, 14, 6, 2 and 1 percent of total world production of 46.01 million tonnes during 2018-19.

According to the all India rabi crop coverage report, Government of India, as on 29th January 2021, groundnut was sown in around 4.76 lakh hectares as compared to last year (4.82 lakh ha). Among the states, Karnataka stood first in area coverage with 1.32 lakh ha followed by Telangana (0.87 lakh ha), Tamil Nadu (0.87 lakh ha), Odisha (0.72 lakh ha), and Andhra Pradesh (0.67 lakh ha).

In Telangana, groundnut has been sown in around 1,90,557 acres as on 3rd February 2021. Among the districts, Nagarkurnool stood first in groundnut sown area with 86,244 acres followed by Wanaparthy (26,941 acres), Gadwal (15,930 acres), Nalgonda (10,189 acres) and Vikarabad (7,328 acres).

Groundnut Price Outlook

The total export of groundnut oil to China has crossed a massive 1.10 lakh tonnes till the end of December as against the total export of 40,000 tonnes in the entire previous financial year.

According to exporters, they already have confirmed orders of 70,000 tonnes for January and February and total export of the season is expected to cross 2 lakh tonnes.

China's total production of groundnut is around 1.5 million tonnes, but the floods last year ravaged nearly 35% of the standing crop. To fulfill the demand gap of 50 lakh tonnes, the country is importing the oil in huge quantities.

The oil deficit in China is so high that they want to import as much as possible of India's production. They are also importing peanuts of even inferior quality to extract oil.

Rajasthan's produce is available at Rs. 4,800 per quintal while Saurashtra's groundnut costs Rs 5,300 -Rs 5,400 per quintal.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expects that groundnut may trade in a range of **Rs.** 5450 – 5950 per quintal during the month of February 2021.
