Groundnut Outlook - March 2021

Groundnut (*Arachis hypogaea L.*) is an important oilseed crop in India which occupies first position in terms of area and second position in terms of production. China ranks first in groundnut production with 17.39 million tonnes followed by India 6.70 million tonnes, Nigeria 2.89 lakh tonnes, Sudan 2.88 million tonnes and Myanmar 1.60 million tonnes accounting for 37, 14, 6, 2 and 1 percent of total world production of 46.01 million tonnes during 2018-19.

According to the all India rabi crop coverage report, Government of India, as on 29th January 2021, groundnut was sown in around 4.76 lakh hectares as compared to last year (4.82 lakh ha). Among the states, Karnataka stood first in area coverage with 1.32 lakh ha followed by Telangana (0.87 lakh ha), Tamil Nadu (0.87 lakh ha), Odisha (0.72 lakh ha), and Andhra Pradesh (0.67 lakh ha).

In Telangana, groundnut has been sown in around 2,72,646 acres as on 3rd March 2021. Among the districts, Nagarkurnool stood first in groundnut sown area with 1,33,224 acres followed by Wanaparthy (32,551 acres), Gadwal (21,801 acres), Nalgonda (17,096 acres) and Vikarabad (8,238 acres).

Groundnut Price Outlook

The total exports of peanut oil to China has crossed 0.11 million tons till the end of December as against a total export of 0.04 million tons in the previous financial year and it is expected to reach 0.2 million tons this year.

Oil crushers have started purchasing peanut from Rajasthan since the peanut prices are 10-12% lower compared to buying from Saurashtra regions. Oil millers are ready to buy peanut from anywhere they get cheaper material to meet demand. On an average, millers crush 1 million tons of peanut to extract 0.3 million tons of oil.

The demand and price for peanut oil in the domestic market rose sharply. Because of increasing transportation cost, lower stock levels, an upcoming new crop and a confused Chinese demand, Indian peanut industry is set to discover new limits in the market.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expects that groundnut may trade in a range of **Rs.** 6250 – 6550 per quintal during the month of March 2021.
