Chilli Outlook - May 2021

India is the world's largest producer, consumer and exporter of chillies. India is the world leader in chilli production followed by China, Thailand, Ethiopia and Indonesia. Indian chilli is considered to be world famous for two important commercial qualities of color and pungency levels. Indian chilli is mainly exported to Asian countries like China, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Bangladesh, Singapore, Thailand, UAE, etc. In India, major chilli producing states are Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka and West Bengal.

In 2019-20, Telangana ranked second in chilli area, production and productivity i.e., 2.98 lakh acres, 3.06 lakh metric tonnes and 1545 Kg per acre respectively. Chilli area and production in Telangana account for 11.59% and 17% of all India area and production respectively. The major chilli growing districts in Telangana are Khammam, Mahbubabad, Gadwal, Suryapet and Warangal (Rural). During 2020-21, 1.91 lakh acres is covered under chilli. According to the 1st advance estimates, Government of Telangana chilli production is estimated as 4.10 lakh metric tonnes during vanakalam (kharif) 2020-21.

From the 1st January 2021 to 22nd Apr 2021, red chilli supply in the Guntur market is reported to add up to around 248,850 MT as compared to last year's 172,800 MT, up by 44.01% as new crop supply continued in the spot market and also expected higher production in current year.

Chilli Price Outlook

Weak sentiment witnessed in Red chilli market, market movement reported slow due to corona virus fear.

As per trade sources, as of now around 48 - 50 lakh bags (1 bag = 40 kgs) new chilli stored at Guntur cold storage of total capacity 70 lakh bags. In the Khammam market, new arrivals reported around 45,000 bags, buyers reported inactive due to lower quality.

Chilli prices may correct from higher levels in the spot market if good quality new arrivals enter the market, also expected higher production in current year.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that Chilli is likely to trade in price range between Rs. 12,500 – 14,500 per quintal in the month of May 2021.
